Abstract

These are some data sources that might be interesting as you begin developing your own projects. Most are free to access, either as a member of the public or as a student/faculty member at SJU. Some sources have paid versions or require a subscription. A general rule of thumb when it comes to collecting data is not to expect that you will be able to simply click one link and receive everything in a single .csv file in the exact format you desire. Often, it requires a process of 'data cleaning', wherein you determine the data you want, read through the documentation, understand its format, and finally import it into R. This is one of the more tedious aspects of data analysis, but it is also a necessary step! Don't get discouraged if you can't find exactly the data you are looking for. Be patient, be creative, and be open to modifying your research goals based on data availability.
