We are looking for a highly skilled and motivated individual to work as a full-time research professional for a period of one to two years. The start date is subject to negotiation, but may be as early as July 1, 2024.

This position is ideal for someone who has a long-term interest in academic research and is planning to go to graduate school in economics, finance or a related field. You will work with NYU Stern Professors <u>Philipp Schnabl</u> and <u>Alexi Savov</u>, who conduct research in financial intermediation, asset pricing and macro-finance. Since many of the projects will involve extensive work with large, proprietary datasets, preference will be given to candidates with prior experience of working with statistical software such as Stata.

The ideal candidate will:

- i. have a strong quantitative background;
- ii. have strong computer skills including programming (Stata, SAS, R, and/or Python are a plus);
- iii. be able to work independently to solve problems; and
- iv. have a long-term interest in pursuing research in finance and/or economics.

A background in economics is a plus, but not necessary – we welcome candidates with strong technical backgrounds who are looking for more exposure to economics and finance.

The position will be based in New York, and the successful candidate will be able to participate in the academic life at NYU, including the ability to attend research seminars and Ph.D. courses. We offer a competitive salary. We can sponsor visa for foreign nationals.

We have a successful placement record. Out of three past research professionals, one is now a Ph.D. student in Economics at Harvard University while two are Ph.D. students in Finance at Stanford Graduate School of Business.
